Pastor's
Corner

Sunday February 10, 2008



Dear Parishioners, the question may arise for some of you as to why we try to *fast* and *abstain* during the time of Lent. Today's Gospel of Matthew that relates our Lord's temptation in the desert (Matthew 4:1-11), gives us good reasons why we are called to do so. First, notice in today's Gospel the three forms of temptations that Jesus himself was subjected to: temptation to food, temptation to putting God to the test, and temptation to power. Jesus fasted and abstained from all these three temptations.

Jesus fasting and abstaining from food in spite of his hunger was his way of saying "no" to the hunger of the flesh to be satisfied by material things. His "no" was to remind us that in the end, material things will not satisfy our deepest hunger but will only leave us spiritually starved. Pope Benedict, commenting on this passage in his book, *Jesus of Nazareth*, notes, *The aid offered by the West to developing countries has been purely technically and materially based, and not only has left God out of the picture, but has driven men away from God... The idea was that we could turn stones into bread; instead, our 'aid' has only given stones in place of bread.*

Jesus abstaining from putting God to the test was his way of saying "no" to our tendency to submit God to our own standards and criteria for concluding whether he cares for us or whether he even exists. Pope Benedict notes, *The arrogance that would make God an object and impose our laboratory conditions upon him is incapable of finding him. For it already implies that we deny God as God by placing ourselves above him, by discarding the whole dimension of love, of interior listening; by no longer acknowledging as real anything but what we can experimentally test and grasp. To think like that is to make oneself God. And to do that is to abase not only God, but the world and oneself, too.*

Finally, Jesus fasting and abstaining from power is his refrain from "power" to achieve his goals. Instead, he chooses to submit himself to God, and to worship God, trusting that it is God who will provide. Again, Pope Benedict notes, Jesus has not brought us "power" for us to worship, but rather, *Jesus has brought God and with God the truth about our origin and destiny...* (Contd...)

(Pastors corner contd ..) *It is only because of our hardness of heart that we think this is too little. Yes, indeed, God's power works quietly in this world, but it is the true and lasting power. Again and again, God's cause seems to be in its death throes. Yet over and over again it proves to be the thing that truly endures and saves.*

As we enter into this Lenten Season on this First Sunday of Lent, let us then take concrete steps to fast and abstain from certain material things, from testing God when things don't go our way, and from relying on "power" rather than God to provide for our needs. And, may these fasts and abstentions of ours during this Lenten Season teach each, just a little more, to follow in the footsteps of our Lord Jesus Christ.
