Pastor's
Corner

Sunday January 27th, 2008



Dear Parishioners, do you sometimes feel as if there are days when you are being pulled in all directions, and you don't know which one to respond to first? Concretely speaking, isn't there always certain days when everything seems to be happening to you at one and the same time? Perhaps you may have your favourite television or radio station blaring, and the cell phone is ringing, you are trying to have a conversation with your husband or children at the top of your voice to set the table, as they sit motionless before the television and computer screens. Meanwhile you are busy stirring the pot on the stove for the family evening meal. You feel that all of these situations need attending to but you don't know which to begin first or which to focus on. Meanwhile, all of these activities occurring simultaneously around you are getting your system so overloaded that by the end of the day, you feel so wired that it is difficult to unwind...

What is the problem with this picture? The *late Henri Nouwen* reminds us that when such an overload occurs, and if they occur often and continuously, then a refocus and simplification of our lifestyle is called for – one refocused on Christ. This is what he says:

“Boredom is a sentiment of disconnectedness... The great paradox of our time is that many of us are busy and bored at the same time. While running from one event to the next, we wonder in our innermost selves if anything is really happening. While we can hardly keep up with our many tasks and obligations, we are not so sure that it would make any difference if we did nothing at all. While people keep pushing us in all directions, we doubt if anyone really cares. In short, while our lives are full, we feel unfulfilled...”




One way to express the spiritual crisis of our time is to say that most of us have an address but cannot be found there. We know where we belong, but we keep being pulled away in many directions, as if we were still homeless. ‘All these other things’ keep demanding our attention. They lead us so far from home that we eventually forget our true address, that is, the place where we can be addressed.

Jesus responds to this condition of being filled yet unfulfilled, very busy yet unconnected, all over the place yet never at home. He wants to bring us to the place where we belong. But his call to live a spiritual life can only be heard when we are willing honestly to confess our own homeless and worrying existence and recognize its fragmenting effect on our daily life. (Pastors corner contd....) Only then can a desire for our true home develop. It is of this desire that Jesus speaks when he says, “Do not worry... Set your hearts on his kingdom first... and all these other things will be given you as well.” In other words, simplify and refocus on Christ. Find time for quiet places and spaces with him, and things will fall into place. There is no other solution to this contemporary problem in our lives. God Bless, Fr. Mark.
