A CHURCH WITHOUT BUILDINGS?

Did you know that until the year 324, there were not any churches built? For almost 300 years, Christianity flourished without any buildings. We celebrate today the anniversary of the dedication of the cathedral church of Rome in 324. Originally known as the Archbasilica of the Most Holy Saviour, the church is called St. John Lateran.

This was the first church ever to be built. Before its construction, the Christians, who were all Catholics, met in private houses for the celebration of the Sunday masses and for every other kind of meeting. They were persecuted by the Roman Empire and could not have any public buildings. In fact, they would change the place of their meetings frequently, to avoid being caught by the Roman Police. It is amazing that the Catholic Church could not only survive, but flourish under such conditions. After the conversion of the Roman Emperor Constantine, it was allowed to have buildings and soon became a major force in the Roman Empire. It survived the decline and fall of the Roman Empire. To borrow the title of a famous Canadian movie by Denis Arcand, it will survive "the decline and fall of the American Empire".

The reason for that strength of the Catholic Church is that it does not receive its unity and its vitality from its individual members, like a secular state. Unlike a secular state, the Church is rooted in a supra-personal unity which

"is prior to its individual members and forms the basis of their union. This supra-personal unity is rooted in the one Spirit of Jesus, in the fullness of his creative truth and grace. This life-giving fullness flows with an exuberant fecundity through all peoples and civilizations, purifying, stimulating, shaping, pervading; but because it comes from the Heart of Jesus, it never loses itself and its supernatural character. We should liken it, therefore, not to a grain of gold discovered in some mass of alien rock, but to a living seed which takes up foreign elements into itself and employs them for the building up of its own structure, yet always and ever according to the law of it being"

As a result we, the individual church members as well as the present Catholic communities, can experience the living God through Christ realizing himself in his Church. As Father Karl Adam wrote, "the Catholic does not come to Christ immediately

and by literary channels, as by Scriptural records, but immediately through personal contact with Christ living in his community!" My gratitude to Magnificat for providing the quotations from Fr. Adam who was a remarkable German priest and Theologian.
