**DO NOT LOOK BACK!**

Sometimes, Jesus seems almost cruel! How could Jesus say "Let the dead bury their own dead." In the time of Jesus, some Jews were willing to do anything in order to bury their fathers and mothers. It was a most sacred duty.

We have to understand the words of Jesus within the Eastern context. Fr. Mark Link, S.J. recalls a recent story about a young Arab who refused a scholarship, saying, "I will take it only after I bury my father. His father was healthy and under fifty. The boy wanted to put off leaving home until his father's death. His father might need him in an old age. Of course, the scholarship didn't wait! He lost it, and by the time his father died, it was too late to start his own family. Still today, we see parents who are willing to sacrifice their child's vocation, priesthood or married life, in order to have them fulfill their self-centered interest. And we see young people unable to fulfill the plan God has for them, because of the guilt they feel towards their family. There is a moment in our life when we have to follow Christ more completely and we should not postpone it. The grace of doing it now may be gone tomorrow.

Then Jesus goes on to say that we cannot look back if we are to move forward. We cannot be held by the past if we are to meet Him in the present. What are the things in your past that are preventing you from following Christ now?

For some, it is an habitual sin, a bad habit. You have come to think of it as a part of your basic identity; a part of your basic need. Surrender it to the Lord, while there is still time. Otherwise, you will become a walking dead man, alive outside, but dead inside.

For some others, it may be their culture that binds them. Christ was free to be counter-cultural when necessary.

Even the commandment "Honour your father and mother" was relativized and subjected to the love of God and neighbour. Elisha burnt the family inheritance in order to follow Elijah. Are we ready to sacrifice something of our culture, when Christ asks us to do so? Christ said we have to prefer Him to our own father and mother and be ready to leave them when He asks us to do so.

Here are some examples of 'cultural traditions' that can oppose the Gospel. In some countries, you cannot have two weddings in the same year, among the siblings. It would be bad luck. Or you cannot marry if there is a death of a relative, like the death of an uncle. This leads to delay of a wedding and leads to an occasion of sin for the engaged couple.

Sometimes, we live in order to please the relatives back home. We lead impossible lives here in Canada to please people overseas who do not know anything about our real life conditions here. Paul, in the second reading, calls us to freedom.

"Brothers and sisters: for freedom Christ set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery."
