#### THE POWER OF BEAUTY

How do you know if there is something after death? The next Catholic Forum at St. Mary's this coming Tuesday night will address the questions of life after death. Some people think it is only a big gamble. Some bet there is life after death. Others bet there is nothing. But this pure gambling will not hold up when you go through difficult moments in your life. Then you will need to see something in this world that will be a glimpse of the world to come, like the beauty of God and the beauty of heaven shining in and through this world.

This is how St. Thomas Aquinas, the Doctor of the Church, saw the Transfiguration of Jesus. He said it was fitting that Jesus Christ be manifested in all His glory, because those who are walking an arduous path need from time to time a clear sense of their goal. What is the arduous path? It is human life with all of its trials and dangers and difficulties: failures and depression, fear of death, sickness, the loss of friends. As we make our way through this life, we are going on an arduous journey. What is the goal of the journey? The beatific vision, the vision of God, the life of heaven, this transfigured and glorious state that God has designed for us. Therefore, said St. Thomas, it is so important for us, at least from time to time, to get a glimpse of the end. The disciples, John, James, and John needed a glimpse of heaven, this momentary breakthrough of the glory that was held out to them. They needed this to keep following Christ to Jerusalem, for during His passion they would be tempted not to believe in Him and in God anymore. Therefore, Thomas concludes that it was fitting that He should show His disciples the glory of His radiance, to which He would configure those who are His, a sense of the end goal.

We are not meant just for this world. No matter how good it is, there is nothing in it that can satisfy our thirst. We need "something" that is more intense, more durable, something that will never die, that will never be washed away by life's trials. Isn't that a sign that we were made for more, and that there must be something that corresponds to that desire? Then that "something" more must be experienced from time to time. That is what happened at the Transfiguration. The light of the World to come, the light of God, the Uncreated Light through which we see light itself came to be seen. This light is meant to awaken our sense of amazement, so that we may forever look at the world in a different way, as the promise of something more real, more beautiful, more lovable.

Why the light? We have always associated holiness with light, with halo, with aura. When Malcolm Muggeridge turned a film in the "House of the Dying of Mother Teresa," this place was so dark and gloomy that the crew felt the film would not pick up anything discernable. When they developed the film in London, they were amazed to see everything in that dark place filled with a gentle warm light. It was coming from Mother Teresa and was moving with her. The camera miraculously seemed to pick up the supernatural light of her holiness. Another time, at another location in a school hall, while Mother Teresa was captivating her audience, not by her words, but because of her very presence, because of some "quality" that came across, over and above her words...at that moment, a luminosity seemed to fill the place, penetrating every mind and heart.

That is what happened, and much more, to John, James and John. This light made them feel understood by Jesus and made them understand who Jesus was.
