Pastor's Corner

WHY WE STILL NEED GOD

Most people today reduce both the spirit of Christianity and its rules, to the second tablet of the Law: those who are concerned with love of neighbor. The first tablet, the first commandments about our duties toward God, are basically ignored. If we neglect these, we then will slowly come to see Christianity as a moral way of life, a wisdom, a way of seeing and living. God will slowly disappear from our horizon. And when this happens in a country, in a culture, everything goes berserk, and mad, as Pope Benedict said.

Look at these facts: 52 million abortions in the U.S.! More deaths through abortion than through World War II. One American state now is looking to legalize post-birth "abortion," that is to kill babies even two months after their birth. Now even Catholic schools in Ontario might be forced by the Government to teach our children the "morality" of same-sex marriage, that is an option just as good as the hetero-sexual marriage. Some American states are pushing to legalize polygamy and polyamory. (This last one means that several men and several women live together and consider themselves legally married to each other and everyone of the group. There are half a million of these in the States.) At the Stanford Symposium, some well known and acclaimed scientists proposed genetic manipulations of the female egg (ovule) that coupled with freezing of the unfertilized ovule would allow women to freeze them when they are young, and choose later, say when they are advanced in their career, to have fertilized in-vitro by a man of their choice, and then have the fertilized egg implanted in a surrogate mother. This way, the woman would not lose any precious time and continue her career without any interruption.

Then consider the "demographic winter." To keep its population at the same level each couple needs to have 2.1 children. Now, we are well below that. Even the immigrants

don't reach that critical 2.1. What are the consequences? Pretty soon it will create the inverted pyramid age distribution: a lot of retired people for few earning workers. Already, some Nordic countries are giving large subsidies to encourage people to have more kids. But in vain! Meanwhile Europe will be populated by a majority of Muslims before 2050. Finally consider the facts that a great proportion of young people don't marry anymore, not even a civil wedding. In the States, 62% of the first babies of women under thirty are born out of wedlock. And with a rate of more than 50% divorce, we will have millions of fatherless children, and many reconstituted families with a lot of step-fathers and step-mothers, and halfsisters and half-brothers. This will create a lot of suffering in the future, and many social problems. To this, let us add world famine in the third world countries; a problem that we could solve if we really wanted to do it.

We need God to really love one another and do what is good for the future of civilization. Without Him, we are unable to die to our own selfish agenda. Selfish love blinds us to the others, and leads us to corrupt judgments, unbridled affections. And it does all this in a manner that is imperceptible to us. Even when, by the grace of God, we become aware of this, we are still unable to do what is right, to love as God loves. We need the grace that can be received only through a real friendship with God, our Lord.
