Do you remember that number? It rated the intensity of last October's earthquake in the Queen Charlotte Islands. That Saturday night, at 8:04pm, I was on the 37th floor of a high rise in New Westminster. The building oscillated. The chandeliers swung for a few minutes. Those who were standing got dizzy. I was becoming anxious. "When will this stop? Is this the big one coming now, that 9.0 earthquake that will throw everything to the ground?" I remembered "Apocalypse Now" and "The Day After."

St. Mark speaks about earthquakes that will happen in various places, wars all over the world and famines. And he says, "These things are merely the beginning of birth pangs." It is scary, because it is just the beginning! It is comforting, because it is the birth pangs. Yes! It announces the renewal of humanity in Christ! Is it coming soon? "No one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." (Mark 13:32) St. Augustine wrote, "It is by design that Jesus hid the last day from us— so that we'd be on the lookout for Him, every day of our lives."

Those who say the end of the world is near show us all the signs we can see now— wars, famines, earthquakes, great moral evil— but they don't draw our attention to Christ. After all it is He, the Christ, who "is near, at the very gates." (Mark 13:29) And He is here to bring us into a rebirth. Yet, it is still scary, because a new birth implies the destruction of what is old, of the present order of things. The world and ourselves will not simply be "renovated." It is beyond repair. It will be "re-created." Just like the flood destroyed what was evil, in the story of Genesis, starting anew with the ark of Noah, so too the world has started anew in Christ. This renewal will be completed at the end of time or rather at the fulfillment of time.

Through Jesus, God entered the world quietly, sneaking beyond the enemies' line, as C.S. Lewis said. He was coming to take back what was His own, rescuing us from the kingdom of darkness into his Kingdom of Light. Evil was so powerful that he had to fight until the very last drop of His blood. On the Cross, Jesus absorbed in Himself all the evil in you and me. He swallowed it up in His Divine Mercy. How do we know that He won the battle? We know it because He resurrected on the third day, as He had promised!
