“Throwing off his cloak, he sprung up and came to Jesus”

Dear Parishioners, (from today's Gospel)

What a dramatic scene! The blind beggar was a homeless street person. He heard the commotion stirred by Jesus' passage on "his" street. He knew he could not join the "procession" following Jesus, because he was blind. The thick crowd formed an unbreakable wall between him and Jesus. How could he navigate through that crowd? Moreover, the crowd was hostile to him. They wanted to keep him away from Jesus, as Jesus was a v.i.p., a "very important person" too busy to take care of a sinful blind beggar. So they thought! But Bartimaeus knew nothing about diplomatic protocol! All he knew was his intense desire to be healed and the power Jesus had to heal him. So he shouted out to Jesus. And the more they tried to stop him, the louder he cried out! Jesus heard his cry. Remember: there is not a crowd in the world with all its might, with all its noise, that can prevent Jesus from hearing your cry!

"Call him here", Jesus said, bringing the whole procession to a grinding stop. Because Jesus stood still, looking in the direction of the shouts of Bartimaeus, the blind beggar, the crowd stopped being a screen between Bartimaeus and Jesus. The crowd became a bridge between these two. The crowd relayed the invitation of Jesus to the ears of the beggar. "Take heart, get up, he is calling you", they said. In a split second, they went from being a hurdle to being a bridge, a passway. I have seen this happening in street ministry.

This is our first challenge. We are called to be a bridge, a pathway between Christ and those who need him! We are to tell them "Take heart; get up, he is calling you." And we won't be able to say that unless we have experienced it in our life. Unless we have been Bartimaeus, a homeless blind beggar, called personally by Christ.

For myself, I am still a blind beggar crying out to Jesus, after twenty-two years of priesthood! But I am being healed and *(contd...)*

I can now follow him, with the crowd of his disciples. And now, I can say to others, "Take heart, get up, Jesus is calling you!"

Take the challenge. Throw off your old cloak, spring up and go to Jesus. You may not see where you are going while on your way to Jesus. But you will see him when you come within personal reach of him, and then you will never watch the procession pass by. You will be a part of it!

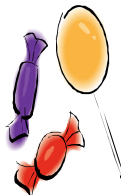
