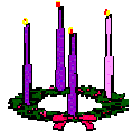
Pastor's

December 21, 2008– 4th Sunday of Advent

“Silence Awaiting Birth”

Dear Parishioners,

As we come to the last Sunday before Christmas, we know that this time of waiting that is “pregnant” with expectation will soon come to birth. That all this waiting will not be in vain for it will at last spring forth its fruit in the birth of our Lord anew, and hopefully, in ever deeper and more profound ways in our lives.



Yet, waiting for great things to happen requires silence first. Yes, silence in expectation... a pregnant silence, yet silence first, if the Word is to spring forth with the fullness of life and grace.

That is why, Christmas **at** Advent just will not do. Christmas at Advent that already calls forth hustle and bustle and making merry does not allow for silence to impregnate our being so that the Word, so full of life and grace, may come forth... Instead, in exchange for this *Gift* that is *the Word*, we will have but bestowed upon ourselves a dullness and flatness of being...

Phillip Roderick drives this point home when he writes,

“On the other hand, silence also leads to words. If you are practising silence, it can be the physical silence of not speaking, but also an inner silence. If you practise silence a lot, your word becomes pregnant, becomes full.

When people talk to you, sometimes it doesn't come from silence; it's rattling, it's noisy. Some people can say very few things, sometimes very simple things, and yet it's enough to make you understand things...

Silence is a place that can give our words symbolic power. Most words are just words, more and more and more words. Silence is a place where words stop. More theologically, God is silence. Out of the silence God speaks the Word and the Word becomes flesh... That's the whole mystery of the Trinity, the relationship between silence and words.”

During these last few days of Advent, let us then nurture silence, that in the silence, the Word may spring forth into our lives, full of life and grace.

MERRY CHRISTMAS

Since I don't have enough time to write my personal Christmas wishes for you before the bulletin deadline, I am sharing this message from Jean Vanier, founder of L'Arche and son of former Governor General George Vanier.:

*“We all have to choose between two ways of being crazy: the foolishness of the Gospel and the non-sense of the values of our world. The Gospel is crazy: it sees in the weak and the poor a sign and a sacrament of God, thus revealing the mystery of Jesus and leading us to a true inner freedom, through a community life with celebrations and relationships. The values of the world are mad: they lead us to seek comfort and riches for ourselves, to reject others, to build protective walls around ourselves, and finally to arm ourselves for better defense. This leads finally to destruction. John Halsey, an Anglican priest of the Community of the Transfiguration in Scotland, once told a group from L'Arche: ‘Either we will continue to **walk on** the poor and that will lead to the explosion of nuclear arms; or we will **walk with** the poor and that will lead to the transfiguration in Jesus Christ.’”*
