

GOD SACRIFICES HIMSELF FOR US!

When I preside Mass, I wear a chasuble, a vestment without sleeves that is similar to what the priests of the ancient time before Christ wore to offer animal sacrifices. This is to signal that Mass is a sacrifice. Notice that in Protestant denominations, the minister who presides the Sunday Liturgy doesn't wear a chasuble but a doctoral robe. He is there to teach only, not to offer a sacrifice. A Sunday "liturgy" at most Protestant Churches is a long, one hour teaching, preceded and followed by praise and worship. The Anglican High Church is an exception because they are not really Protestant but "Catholics" separated from Rome. So also the Orthodox Church (in a different way.)

Now you understand why it is important to understand that the Mass is a sacrifice, not just a Liturgy of the Word, with a teaching on the Scriptures. What is a sacrifice? Why do we offer a sacrifice? The first reason is this. We offer something to God because we have received everything from Him: life, existence, the earth, our very talents. We need to give Him back something. Something very good. This is strict justice. In a relationship with a person, you cannot only receive, you must give. Even a little child feels the need to give a small gift to his parents, even if he has to take it from what belongs to them. And the parents accept the gift with joy, not because they need the gift, not because the gift is worth a lot of money, but because it expresses the love and the gratitude of their child towards them. They are happy, because through that gift, their child becomes a giver, not just a receiver. He becomes like them. God too rejoices in our sacrifice for it transforms us into His likeness. Mass is a sacrifice that is due to God in justice. That is why we are obliged to attend Mass every Sunday. Mass is a sacrifice that transforms us into the likeness of God, capable of a real interaction with God, giving and receiving.

Now let us push this one step further. Because of sin, we are off kilter with God. Our relationship with Him is skewed, twisted. We don't recognize His authority and Lordship. We use our gifts against His will as if they were never given, but resulted in our own activity. We steal God's gifts by grasping them as if they were not received from Him, and by pretending they are the fruit of our own doing. We become rivals of God. Or rather God becomes a threatening rival to us. We need to straighten our relationship with God, by giving God His proper place in our lives. This is going to be hard! Here is an analogy. If a husband who has committed adultery wants to restore his relationship with his wife, it will require a lot of sacrifice and a lot of humility. So it is with God. God delights in our painful sacrifices, not because He needs them, but because through them, we express our commitment to belong to Him.

Now nothing we can offer to God is enough to make amends and to straighten our relationship, because God is infinitely worthy and we are not. So we need Christ's offering of Himself as both Man and God to restore our relationship with God. We need a sin offering, a sacrifice of expiation, of reparation. On the Cross, Christ performed this sacrifice once and for all, by giving His Life, and shedding His Blood for the forgiveness of our sins. The Mass is the reenactment of this Sacrifice. In the sacrifices of old, animals were slain, and gave their blood. Now Jesus Christ on the cross does it. "This is My Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many, for the forgiveness of sins, Do this in memory of me." Each time, we participate in Mass, we are transferred at the foot of the Cross, with Mary and John and we receive His last Words, His last drop of Blood.

PROJECT ADVANCE - DID YOU KNOW?

Extra Tax Credit for First Time Donors! The federal government has created the Super Tax Credit for First Time Donors, in a move to encourage first time donors, particularly young people. If you have not claimed income tax credits for charitable gifts before, you could be eligible for this special tax benefit which increases the existing charitable tax credit by 25% for donations of up to \$1,000 claimed in any one tax year from 2013 to 2017. Donations to your parish or to Project Advance count! Our current total is \$86,850, or 87% of the diocesan goal. We still have a way to go to our parish goal of \$200,000, but are inching our way there. Thank you so much for your generosity!
