Pastor's Corner

LOVE OR CONDEMNATION?

Today's Gospel speaks about the encounter of Jesus, a Pharisee and a public sinner. The Pharisee is a "religious enforcer." You have met them in today's life. The "religious enforcer" is quick to detect all the sins of others, whether these sins are moral, liturgical or doctrinal "error." These "law enforcers" usually see confessions as a laundry job, prepared by a long examination of conscience, checking a list of 99 possible sins.

Pope Francis in his homily of April 29 said the Confessional is not a "dry cleaner" where our sins are automatically washed away...and then we get dirty again, and go back. Even though we have to confess the same sins over and over again for many years- and that has been my case too! - there is a better way to understand sin and confession. Rather than focusing on each individual sin committed, let us think of sin as a state of sin. We are all sinful not because we are full of a big number of sins, but because we are marked through and through by a state of sin. St. Augustine defined sin as being "caved in on oneself." Dante described it as being stuck in ice, being frozen. In the 20th century, we use words like alienation and separation. Fr. Barron said in his homily #492, that "to be in sin is to be cut off from the deepest source of life. It is to have severed your link to God." Certain things will follow from that state of sin. If you are cut off from God, the source of life, you will become afraid and live your life defensively, "caving in around yourself" (St. Augustine.) And then, in your fear, you will start grasping and clinging to those things that you think you need in order to survive. Those things are usually power, pleasure, money and possessions, prestige and honour and recognition. You try to fill up your life with more and more of these, to avoid sadness and a sense of failure.

What else follows from being cut off from God? You will see your fellow human beings as threats! Yes, because other people can take the title of power, job, pleasure, money and honour that is out there to get. It is a scarce environment. So you attack others, defend yourself against them. You are led to icy alienation and separation. So we can see that sin, being cut off from God, conduces to all the familiar sins, all those forms, of hatred and cruelty, all gossiping, all slander, all maliciousness, all adultery. These come from that underlying state of being in the state of sin, of being cut off from God. Good confessors and spiritual directors learn to look beyond symptoms to underlying causes. Much like a doctor who does not simply treat symptoms but looks to the underlying disease.

Jesus is interested in that deep down spiritual disease that manifests itself in the numerous sins on the surface. But we tend to tell others "Stop doing these sins, you are so bad." This is not very helpful, because we, sinners, know that to be aware of a particular sin and to stop doing it are two very different things.

How does this work? What do I mean when I say we need to be re-connected to the very Source of Life? Suppose you are dealing with the sin of lust. Listen to what you are feeling inside when you are most tempted. Is it loneliness or anger, or a sense of being rejected, not wanted? Is it fear, or a sense of failure, or hopelessness> What are the circumstances that trigger your sin? Ask Him to unblock that Source which wants to flow in your heart. Jesus said in John 7, "Those who believe in me, their hearts will drink to that fountain of Living Water (The Holy Spirit) which flows in them" and He said, "Whoever drinks this water (possessions, power, honour) will get thirsty again, but anyone who drinks the water that I shall give will never be thirsty again: the water that I shall give will turn into a spring inside him, welling up to eternal life." (John 4: 13-14) What is that Source of Living Water? The Holy Spirit who is Love. That is why the sinful but forgiven woman abounds with love, joy and gratitude, while the Pharisee is grumbling against Jesus and shows no love. The woman chose to live from the abundance of the Source. The Pharisee lives in a world of scarcity and condemnation.
