

# Pastor's Corner

## AFFIRM, FORGIVE, TEACH AND SET FREE

Today we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. However we do more than watch this baptism from the outside, as surveyors of a distant historical scene. No, we participate in it now. And we appropriate the baptism of Jesus by living it now. We can understand this by looking at the rites of baptism, especially the anointing with the oil of chrism, by which we share in the very anointing Jesus received when He was baptized. The second reading for today, from St. Peter, reminds us that Jesus, in His human nature, was anointed with the Holy Spirit by God, the Father, This empowered Him to fulfill His mission of bringing God's love to us, to heal and deliver people from the oppression of the devil. This is evident when we look at Jesus' inaugural speech, that we can call "His mission statement." It is in Luke 4:12-21, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because He has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives, and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour."

Now, when we are baptized, we are empowered by the same anointing that Jesus received. Therefore we receive the same mission. This becomes more evident when we look at the origin of the word "anointed": it is an English translation of the Hebrew word "Messiah" or "Christ" in Greek. Therefore when we are anointed in baptism, we become little Christ or little "Messiah." In fact through baptism, we are incorporated into Christ's Body, which is anointed.

Therefore, our mission is like the one described in Luke 4:18-21. We are called to bring good news to the poor. This includes the poor in spirit. We do that through the gift of "encouragement", one of the charisms given at baptism and confirmation. We exhort and affirm people. This is what the Father did for Jesus, when He said, "You are my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." Parents, do this for your

children. Priests do this for your parishioners. Volunteers in the parish, do this for one another and for the people you are serving. Husband and wife, do this for one another. Teachers, affirm your students. Do not discourage them.

Next, Jesus said, "The Spirit of the Lord has anointed me to proclaim release to the captives." (Luke 4:18) We share in this mission, when, empowered by the Spirit of our baptismal anointing, we forgive with the very forgiveness of God and release our enemies for the prison of their guilt.

Next Jesus said His anointing is ordained "to the recovery of sight to blind." (Luke 4:18) We do this when we teach our kids, and witness the truth of the Gospel to the adults and teens by the way we live. If the people with whom you work don't know that you are Catholic, you may not be fulfilling this part of your mission statement.

Finally Jesus said His mission is to let the oppressed go free. Those who have the charism of deliverance and are helped by your intercessory prayers, fulfill this mission directly. They take away the burden put on by the evil one and his mignons. But you can also unload people, coworkers, family members from their burden, by sharing it with them. Jesus said, "Come to Me, you who carry heavy burdens. My burden is light, my yoke is gentle, and you will find rest for your soul." Parents, understand the burden of your children and help them carry it. Children, do the same for your parents. Pray for one another.


By doing this, we honour the Baptism of the Lord.
