# Pastor's Corner

#### **KARMA OR LOVE?**

Do you think Christ was paying for the "karma" of our sins with His immense suffering? No! It is not the suffering, even Christ's suffering that has a value in itself! That might come from the belief in reincarnation. In this belief, you are not really forgiven, but you pay, by a certain amount of suffering, for the damage you have done.

What does save us in the passion of Christ? Not suffering itself. Suffering is the occasion Christ uses to show us His love without restraint. Fr. Mark Link, S.J., in his book "Mission" on page 106, quotes Anthony Padovano, "We are saved, not by the physical death of Jesus, but by the absoluteness of a love which did not count death (and suffering) too high a price."

In other words, love expresses itself in sacrifice. Accepting the sacrifice required in loving faithfully someone, expresses our love for that person <u>and</u> makes this love stronger, deeper, more real.

In God Himself, things are different. God the Father eternally and joyfully loves the Son without having to renounce Himself. Because He is love. There is no selfishness to overcome in Him. Love is <u>not</u> something He does sometimes, having to force Himself to really love. No, Love is something He is; joyfully, eternally and freely. Of course, this same truth applies to the Son and the Spirit.

But can you understand and live such a Love? No! Because we are a limited creatures, marked by the ingrained selfishness and rebellion of original sin, because of that, we resist the self-giving that Love requests. We need to sacrifice our pride and selfishness to truly love. Sacrifice, suffering accepted, when it is permitted by God, all this lived in union with Christ's passion, leads us to a greater love, ultimately to a joyful and eternal love.



Make no mistake! This kind of love is beyond our reach. We need three things. First, to know and see that God Himself through Christ has shared in our human, suffering love. God experimented death and the agony of our lives on the Cross. So, we know His love is real!

Secondly, we need to believe by grace, that Christ never leaves us alone even in the worst suffering. "Nothing can separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus." (Romans 8:38)

Thirdly, we need the grace to choose Love, even when it entails great suffering. God will give you the desire and that strength to do so. Little by little, day by day, He will do so. But you have to ask for it humbly, not as something due to you, but as a pure grace, an unmerited gift.
