

### **IF AT FIRST GOD REMAINS SILENT...**

When I came to St. Mary's as an assistant pastor, fourteen years ago, a Filipino man told me with a smile, "A Filipino will not take no for an answer. He will come back again and again, with a mix of humility and boldness until you say yes!" Today's Gospel shows us a foreign woman with a similar attitude. She is a Canaanite, who knew she was hated by the Jews, and despite the triple rebuke of Jesus and His disciples, gets bolder and bolder until she gets from Jesus the healing of her daughter.

Everywhere in the world, vulnerable foreigners who try to get a work permit or a permanent resident status are put to the test and submitted to great humiliations. I myself have tasted a bit of that in France, when I stayed there for 18 months. At restaurants, the waiters would talk to me with disdain, making fun of my French Canadian accent, pretending they could not understand my French, mocking my choice of dishes on their menu list. "No, Monsieur, you can't drink that kind of wine, with that fish." And if I would require some paper from their government, a clerk would examine all the required documents and say, "Monsieur has forgotten to make 3 copies of that paper. Go back home and get your paper right." But I could see their copier just a few feet away. "No Monsieur, ca ne se fait pas." "It can't be done! Go back home and try again."

Today's Gospel, reminds us of the dignity of foreigners, especially those who are vulnerable, and have no recourse. And those who speak our language with a strong accent. Don't treat them as if they were stupid or less educated. But, wait a minute, was Jesus being mean to that Canaanite woman? No, He is testing her! Is she there just for a quick fix, wanting a magical solution to her p



problem, treating Jesus like a witch doctor? Of course, He knows what is in her heart. He is God, after all! But He wants to strengthen her by resisting her requests. He also wants to teach His disciples— and that includes you and me— a good lesson about prayer.

Listen. If your child wants first class baseball equipment, you will first buy a used, cheap one and see how he perseveres. You will throw the ball stronger and stronger at him, and let him compete with boys and girls who have an edge because of their equipment. Then you will buy him what he needs, God does the same. He doesn't answer right away our request. He lets our desire for what we need grow stronger and stronger...until we get that mix of humility and boldness with Him. He wants us to acknowledge that He is Lord, and we have no bragging rights on Him. Everything is a free gift, that we don't deserve. But also He wants us to be bold with Him in our requests like a son and daughter are bold with their mother and father. He is both our God and our closest friend. Does our prayer reflect this relationship?
