# ST. MARY'S: FROM MUSTARD SEED TO A BIG TREE

There is a particular species of bamboo tree whose growth is quite special. You throw a seed of that tree and nothing visible happens for 30 years! Then a small sprout comes up. From now on, the growth is spectacular. Within a few months, it becomes a huge tree. The sower doesn't need to know how it happens. It just happens. In fact the explanation is simple. For 30 years, the growth is underground. The seed develops into a huge network of roots one kilometer long. So when it's time, the seed sprouts out of the ground and has this huge network of roots to feed its growth. Such is the spiritual growth of the Kingdom, in the Church, in a parish fully alive, and in our personal lives. I can testify to that.

You cannot explain how the Kingdom of God grows in you, in St. Mary's, in the world. It just happens. But you need trust, patience, humility, and hope. Let God apply His own timing! Do not force the growth and impose your own timing. The beginning of our own spiritual life, or of Christian community is always very humble, very insignificant. Look at today's parable of the mustard seed. It is the smallest and most insignificant seed; yet it becomes a great tree "and puts forth large branches so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade." (Mark 4:32)

The first Christians believed that <u>Jesus Christ crucified was Himself that mustard seed</u>. When He died on a cross, He was considered a criminal. His disciples had run away from Him, His enemies were making fun of Him, while He felt the burden of guilt and of "separation" from God on His shoulders. Yet 30 years later, the Christian communities in the Roman Empire became so fervent that the emperor felt he had to eliminate them. Nowadays the Christian faith is the fastest growing and most persecuted religion in the world. One billion members, spectacular growth in Asia and

in Africa!

Can you imagine a more humble and "hopeless' beginning than the Crucified Jesus, mocked, abandoned, rejected? Can you explain that spectacular growth despite heavy persecutions, divisions, calumny?

I have been long enough at St. Mary's to see that pattern happening. In 2000, the parking lot at St. Mary's was empty except on Sundays and Monday nights for bingo! Every day of the week, the rectory was very quiet. One part time secretary could do the bookkeeping and the reception and manage the filing of documents. Now we have a staff of 5 full time lay people and one full time volunteer. The Sunday attendance has more than doubled since 2005. So did the number of ministries and service groups.

But to me, the most significant change is still invisible, but very real: the inner transformation of hundreds of people. I see it day after day in the confessional, or during spiritual direction (twenty five hours a week) and in all kinds of sharing groups and random conversations. Priests from other parishes notice something special about the confessions that they are hearing at St. Mary's. It's a sense of a relationship to God, and understanding or experience of His great love, a sense of what sin is about. By the way, during last Holy Week, from Palm Sunday to Holy Saturday, we confessed close to 1,000 penitents. Then there is all those people who are touched by the Baptism with the Holy Spirit, or the release of the graces received at their sacramental baptism long ago. Finally, because I am running out of space, Mary our patroness, draws so many people to Christ.

Now, not a single factor, like priests, volunteers, or movements, can explain all this. It's like the mustard seed that grows day in, day out, while you sleep...and you don't know how! Only God can touch our souls and transform us. Have a happy harvest.
