Pastor's Corner

A NEW WORLD WILL BE BORN SOON

If you Google Apocalypse or End times, you could get a million references! The movie "Apocalypse Now" was viewed on TV by 100 million people in the U.S. alone in one evening. Apocalypse, in the Bible, is not about the end of the world but about the <u>unveiling</u> of a new world. The veil taken away by Christ is the veil of death. By dying and rising from the dead, Christ is the first born of a new era, first born of a new humanity, freed from the fear of death.

Let's look at this "Good News" more closely. Apocalypsus was the word used by the Greek Bible. "Apo" means taken away, and "calypsus" means veil. When St. Jerome translated the Bible in Latin, he chose the word "revelatio" as equivalent of the Greek apocalypsus. Literally revelation comes from "re" to remove, and "velum," veil; the removing of the veil, or unveiling. Car manufacturers unveil their new cars with great fanfare.

What more can we learn from the religious studies on the Apocalyptic literary genre? In the Bible, it stands for a coded language that cannot be taken literally, but symbolically. It has a combination of three elements:

- 1) An account of great military struggles. Just at the beginning of Chapter 13 of Mark, Jesus prophesies the destruction of the Temple of Jerusalem. It happened about 40 years after Jesus' death and resurrection. A war in which maybe one million people perished, many of them by famine! A few verses after that Jesus said, "Nation will fight against nation, kingdom against kingdom. (Mark 13:8)
- 2) Meanwhile there will be signs and wonders in heaven. In today's passage from Mark 13 we read "In those days, after the time of suffering, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light and the stars of heaven will be shaken." (Mark 13:24) Don't take this literally! We now know that the smallest star is many, many million times bigger than the

earth. It cannot fall on the earth, there is not enough space for one, let alone for one third of the billions of stars! Each star was believed to be a spiritual being of light. They could be good or bad spirits. The Book of Revelation says that one third of the stars will fall on the earth, these are believed to be fallen angels, demonic entities, evil spirits under the rule of <u>Lucifer</u>, the King of Darkness, pitched against Christ, the King of Light. It will be a time of extreme spiritual warfare. (see Element #1)

3) But "this is the beginning of the birth pangs." (Mark 13:8) A new world is being borne, or unveiled (Apocalypse.) "And then they will see the Son of Man (see Daniel 7:13-14) coming in the clouds with great power and glory. And then He will send the angels to gather his elect from the four winds, from the end of the world to the ends of the sky." (Mark 13: 24-27) This is the third element of the Apocalyptic genre: the survival of a remnant of true believers. These are the ones who will become brothers and sisters of Christ in the world of the Resurrection, where everything is made new. No more fear of death, therefore no need for pride or self-aggrandizement, no envy, no violence, no unforgiveness, no tyranny. Basically, Apocalypse is Good News. But the transition from the old to the new is going to be difficult. It requires our full commitment to trust God in every situation. Are you ready for it? How can you get ready?

This is where the Church comes in. After the great victory of Christ over the Kingdom of darkness on Good Friday, there is still a lot of "mop up operations" to do. We are to gather as many people as we can, from the four winds to bring them up to Christ with the help of the good angels. That is what Evangelization is all about. We want to make Christ's death and resurrection fully effective in the lives of as many people as possible. In doing this, we find our ultimate joy and purpose, and we get ready for the Kingdom of Light.
