#### Pastor's Corner

### 25th SUNDAY In Ordinary Time

September 24th, 2006



Dear Parishioners, This week's *Vancouver Sun* had an article noting the finger pointing that is presently going on between two countries – one, a superpower, accuses the other of developing weapons of mass destruction. The other, a growing regional power, accuses the superpower of using its political and economic strength to muscle its way into the region so as to appropriate the resources of the region for itself. And so, on and on it goes as both sides attempt to gain powerful allies onto their side to force the hand of the other into submission.

In a lot of ways, this present reality at the international scene is not so different from what went on in today's Gospel among the apostles, and, for that matter, what has been going on between human beings for centuries.

Today's Gospel brings to the reader's attention, the disciples arguing on the way to Capernaum as to who was the greatest among them, and I suppose, we can infer from this, who will have the ultimate deference of the rest. But, instead of egging them on in this silly game of theirs, Jesus does an about face by noting to them that whosoever welcomes a little child in his name also welcomes him. Why a "child" as his example? Precisely because a "child" represents one without power and, as such, one that cannot force others into submission. Because of this, a "child" represents one who is easily forgotten in the crowd, and in a world that panders to the strong, the powerful, and now, increasingly, the Hollywood crowd of the "beautiful"!

But, it is precisely to the "weak", the "faceless" and "defenseless" that today's Gospel calls our attention to. For, as Christians, we are called to be in service to those who have "nothing" and are often forgotten as "nothing" by our world. On a wider scale, this can be as a voice on behalf of those suffering in places such as Darfur, Sudan, and, on a scale, closer to home, as a voice on behalf of the aged, the poor, the street-people, the single mothers and, yes, the unborn. Of course, when Jesus calls our attention to such as these, when Jesus calls our attention to a "child", he does not pretend that by doing so, we will resolve the jostling of power among the rich, the powerful and the beautiful. After all, even his disciples were tempted to jostle for power during his three and a half year ministry with them. However, it is perhaps through befriending the least and reminding others of them that Jesus hopes to remind ourselves and others that those acts of ours on behalf of places of honour and power are, in final respects, just as Jesus would have regarded them, "silly acts" that will only bring unfortunate and sad consequences in their wake. *God Bless, Fr.
