Pastor's Corner

GOD THE SUGAR DADDY OR GOD THE TYRANT

Churches, parishes, families have always been divided in their understanding of God. The most conservative tend to value God's justice and His demands on us. But they often do this at the expense of God's mercy. The more importance they give to the justice of God, the less they give to His mercy. On the other end, there are those who give more importance to the mercy of God at the expense of justice. They are more influenced by the Vatican II council and by great contemporary saints like John Paul II, St. Therese of the Child Jesus, Mother Teresa, Saint Faustina. Sometimes you can see in your own family the division splitting generations. Mothers and fathers stress the demands of the God of Justice, while the younger ones stress the forgiveness of God.

So we have two competing images of God. The God of justice, when imputed of His mercy, looks like a tyrant, who broods over us. He could send us to hell anytime for an impure thought and maybe He is seeking an occasion to get us. We know that this is not the God of Jesus.

On the other hand, we have the God who is mercy itself but not just. That God would not make any demand on us. He would not call us to perfection. He would be satisfied with leaving us in the mud of our sins and miseries, and save us after death. That is not the God of Jesus. It is a "sugar daddy God" who doesn't challenge us to be perfect as He is.

Neither of these two views of God are faithful to who God is. Why? Because God is both infinitely just and infinitely merciful at the same time. Yes God is infinite. This means that everything about Him is infinite, in every way. Whatever He does, He does infinitely. He loves both the sinner and the just infinitely. He loves Hitler as much as He loves Mother Teresa.

"God is not a distant figure, very hard to please." (Fr. Barron) His mercy is not conditional. Of course, we need to Pastor's Corner Continued...

accept this mercy so that it may bear fruit in us. God comes to us, not us to Him. He runs after us, like He did run towards the Prodigal Son. He comes into our space. That is what the Incarnation is about, "He who had no sin was made sin for us." (2 Cor. 5:21) He will follow us down, no matter how low we fall, to pick us up, like the eagle dives to catch her little one falling into the abyss.

"The more we run, the more He runs after us. The more we hide, the more He looks. The more we resist, the more He persists." (Fr. Barron) St. Thomas Aguinas said that God's mercy is more important because it is the face that Love takes when turned toward us. And God is love. Everything in God, yes even His justice, must be understood through His Mercy. Because He is Love. St. Therese of Lisieux said "In the end, do you want to be judged by Mercy or by Justice?" Myself, I prefer to rely on His Mercy."
