Pastor's Corner

DEAD SILENCE

Today's Gospel from Mark 7:31-37, relates one of the many miracles Jesus did throughout His three years of ministry. St. John tells us that Jesus worked so many signs and miracles that "if all was written down, the world itself would not hold all the books that would have to be written." (John 221:25) In other words, the miracles that are related in the four Gospels that we have, represent only a very small fraction of those that Jesus did.

What criteria did the Gospel writers use to select the miracles they put in our Bible? They chose those having a deep symbolic resonance. Those we could relate to in our spiritual life, those who were symbolic of spiritual healing. "Jesus came so that we may have life, life to the fullest." (John 10:10) This means, not only physical healing, but deep spiritual healing. On the Cross, Jesus showed us the length, the depth and the width of God's love for us. Through the miracles, He expressed the healing power of this love for us.

Let's apply this to the healing of the deaf–mute in to-day's Gospel. Fr. Mark Link S.J. wrote: "Many awake each day not to the sound of an alarm on a table, but to the whir of a vibrator under a pillow. Like the deaf-mute in the gospel, these people live in a silent world. For them, turning on the radio is useless. Watching TV is a bland experience. Conversation is virtually impossible, But the plight of a *physical* deaf-mute is nothing compared to the plight of a *spiritual* deaf-mute—someone who can't hear God or talk to God in prayer. And all of us fall into this category, at least at times in our lives. Spiritually, we live in a silent world."

"Have I ever asked Jesus to take me off "away from the crowd" and heal me of my *spiritual* deafness and dumbness?"

Most of us, have experienced the silence of God but few ever wondered if in fact, they could be deaf to His voice, not attuned to it, too busy with all the voices and lures of this world, putting these first in their agenda, and slowly but surely becoming cut off from God. What if God is always speaking, but we became deaf? That is what the Psalm 139 says.

Today's first reading from Isaiah 35:4-7 relates the kind of miracles the Messiah would do to bring back His people from exile. Jesus is the Messiah that brings us back to God, from whom we came forth. We still have to take a long journey, hard and dangerous. But the Lord wants to heal us from the greatest obstacles that we will encounter during the journey. They come from within ourselves: being spiritually blind, deaf, mute, lame. How can we walk safely to our Home, if we can't see the obstacles, and hear His guiding voice?

At baptism, the Lord anointed us with the "oil of salvation" through which our ears were opened (Ephphatha) to the Word of God, and our eyes were opened to His presence. This started a spiritual healing of mind and heart so we could see, and hear God. Indeed our mind and will have been wounded and weakened by the consequences of the original sin. How can we reactivate that healing grace of baptism? Each night, ask God for His light to see your day. Review it with Him. Choose one thing that you should be grateful for. And one thing that you need to ask forgiveness for. For example you might have lost patience, or you might do good things but with the intention of being praised and honoured. Or you might have been a slave to selfish pleasures. Maybe you compromised the truth (you lied) in order to look good. You sought your happiness in the wrong places. After this brief review of your day, ask pardon for what went wrong and be grateful for what was good. Finally ask the grace to do better for the coming day. You can also do the examen in the morning or even when commuting, or walking the dog! After a while, the obstacles that prevent you from hearing God will be removed.

"Is anything too hard for the Lord?" (Genesis 18:14)
