Pastor's Corner

CALLED TO A LOVE THAT IS RADICAL, **UNIVERSAL AND INTIMATE**

"Father, will I recognize my husband in heaven? And my children? Jesus said that we will be like angels, and that we won't marry in heaven. What if I am a widow and get married again, will I have two jealous husbands in heaven?" Few people dare to ask these questions, and they are misled to believe that all our present relationships on earth will be forgotten in heaven and that we won't recognize one another. Moreover, they are led to believe that we will somewhat be like ghosts, non-physical persons. If that would be the case, the Resurrection from the dead would not be real: it would be just about the survival of the soul.

But our first reading today, from the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time of Year C. clears that issue. Even before Christ was born, in the Old Testament, the Bible affirms that those who are martyred for the sake of fidelity to God's laws will rise up after death with their bodies. When one of the Maccabees was asked to present his tongue and extend his hands so that the executioner might cut them off, he said, "I got these from Heaven, and because of God's laws I disdain them, and from God I hope to get them back again."(2 Maccabees 7:9-11)

Throughout the Church history, tens of thousands of people died as martyrs. Nearly all the popes of the first three centuries died as martyrs. In the 20th century, more people died as martyrs, some as young as 14 years old, than all the previous centuries combined. Recently, in February 2015, 20 Coptic Christians were martyred by ISIS. Just before being beheaded, some of them spoke the Name of Jesus. And another one, who was not Christian but a co-worker with them, said "Their God is my God", and he was killed with them.

When I read the stories of martyrs, I am amazed at their certitude about heaven and Resurrection. They die joyfully, often praising the Lord at the moment of death. They have received a special grace. Don't doubt you will receive that grace, too, if you are called to witness Jesus through

your death, whether through martyrdom or through natural cause.

Now in the Gospel, Jesus extended the gift of Resurrection to all who believe in Him. In today's Gospel, he says, "The fact that the dead are raised, Moses himself showed in the story about the bush..." (Luke 20:37). And Jesus says that in Heaven, we will be "children of the Resurrection, children of God." (Luke 20:36)

We will be like Him, the Risen Jesus, fully human, and able to love everyone, as He loves everyone. Jesus said he is the Bridegroom of all God's people. He can love each and every one with love that is more powerful and more intimate than the love between husband and wife in this life. And Jesus proved it through the lives of the Saints. In Heaven, we will have a Risen body like his, and we will love all, perfectly, more than any husband and wife can love each other. Some saints have received the gift of love even before dying. But left to themselves, they would have never been able to do that. You can start now, growing to that kind of love, until you receive it perfectly in heaven.
