Pastor's Corner

DREAM BIG

Corner Have you ever been in a difficult situation where you can't see any positive issue every which way you look at the dilemma you were facing, a situation where nothing would seem to be good, such as loss of a job, loss of your reputation, shattering of your plans for your future retirement, etc.?

Joseph, when publicly engaged to Mary, found himself in a similar situation when he discovered that Mary was pregnant and he wasn't the father. The law of the old covenant (before Christ) required that he divorce her publicly. She could have been stoned to death. Yet he still loved her very much. He thought of dismissing her quietly so she could escape the stoning and maybe pursue her life with the adulterous natural father of the child. He thought of saving her at the expense of his own reputation.

Maybe Joseph thought for a moment that Mary had been raped. But if that would have been the case, then Mary would have told him. Mary's silence was a torture for Joseph. And for Mary who also could not explain the action of God to Joseph. She believed that God himself would give him the grace of understanding the whole situation. But until that grace, that revelation from an angel in a dream, all the plans of Joseph were shattered. He thought he could never espouse Mary.

I have had this experience in my ministry of having a couple who cancelled their wedding less than a month before the wedding date. The gifts had to be returned; the fiancée had to explain to the guests what was happening. There were a lot of sadness, shame and guilt.

On top of this similar experience, Joseph also had to suffer a spiritual trauma. "Why did God allow this? Why is this happening to me?" Because of his intimate relationship with God, these painful questions were all the more intense for him.

But Joseph received the message of the Angel with an open heart, "Do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife,

for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and YOU are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." Immediately Joseph did as the angel commanded him; he took Mary as his wife.

Joseph was able, with the grace of God, to expand his mind and his will so as to take in the mind and will of God. He hoped beyond what he could see and feel. He could have chosen to say, "No, this is too good to be true. Mary, the Mother of God, and me, the adopted father of the Son of God! No way! Impossible!"

Are you willing to expand your horizons, renounce your former plans and accept the greater plans of God for you? God has big dreams for you, to transform you into the likeness of His Son. Will you accept the challenge?
